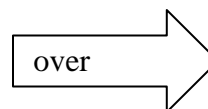

Catholic Social Justice and Service is a key component of our faith and our parish. Formation classrooms are encouraged to devise projects where families and youth work together to serve the St. Joseph University Parish Community and the community at large.

The opportunity of this new curriculum gives the formation office a chance to evaluate our current offerings and renew our vision for the future of parish Lifelong Faith Formation. As part of the new curriculum, we are implementing a five year plan to do just that.

1. This first year we are learning the curriculum and defining formation. We will be gathering interested stakeholders, parents, catechists and parish leadership to sessions to share and process how we have been doing in light of the new curriculum and where we have opportunities to grow. This is our dreaming year to brainstorm our future and educating the parish on the new curriculum models and seeking their input. *Completed 2016-17 dmb*
2. In the second year, we will evaluate all our materials to ensure we have the best tools to teach and model the faith for families and children now that all have used the curriculum for the first year and have larger vision for where we intend to go. *Completed 2017-18 dmb*
3. Having made programming and material adjustments, by year three, we should have all areas of the new curriculum fully integrated and new programs or initiatives in place, including staffing needs both volunteer and paid. Evaluations for the end of year will focus on areas where we have made strides, and where we need to continue to meet the needs of families in the new models. Specifically what do we need to do better, and where do we need to add or cut programming *Completed 2018-19 dmb*
4. Year four will continue to evaluate how well we are moving toward our goal and be able to target specific areas that still need improvement. *Completed 2019-20 dmb*
5. Year five evaluate with staff and families if we have reached the goal and begin to reinvest into our next five year plan. *(and then Covid-19 hit! We will be completing all formation classes online to begin the year and will reevaluate for the second semester.)*

Fee schedule: for a family unit- \$100 for one child; \$150 for two children; \$175 for three or more children- Sacrament fees are separate from the formation family fee and are listed on the registration forms.

There is an out of parish assessment of \$250 per family if you are not a registered member of the parish. We invite all our families to consider formally joining the parish, as the parish supports the ministry of educating in the Catholic faith. You join the parish by attending a new parishioner welcome and completing your paperwork. When you receive your welcome letter you are officially members.
